<u>Coconut water</u> is a natural source of minerals, including potassium, magnesium, calcium and sodium. Many of us don't get enough of these important <u>electrolyte</u> minerals, which play a key role throughout the body, including for heart health and skeletal and muscle function.

Research on animals suggests that coconut water contains compounds that have a protective, antioxidant effect. Two of the phytonutrients that have these effects are <u>shikimic acid</u> and <u>caffeic acid</u>, and the benefits in the studies ranged from decreased cholesterol markers to improvements in liver health. However, to date there have been no human studies to replicate these findings, so it's too early to say whether the same benefits may be relevant for us.

Animal <u>studies</u> suggest that coconut water may help manage blood sugar levels and reduce the damaging effects of <u>oxidative stress</u> associated with conditions like diabetes. Being a source of <u>magnesium</u> may also contribute to coconut water's benefits, because magnesium helps manage blood sugar levels, especially among those with diabetes. Although animal studies appear encouraging, more research is needed to evaluate these effects in humans.

It has been suggested that consuming coconut water may improve endurance and athletic performance. This is because it contains carbohydrate in the form of glucose (a simple sugar) combined with the electrolyte minerals sodium and potassium – two key components typically found in commercial sports drinks.

Although plain water is a good choice, studies suggest that coconut water might be even better. Early research suggests that water from coconuts may help prevent kidney stones by reducing crystal and stone formation. However, more studies have to be done — specifically involving humans.

One <u>study</u> found that drinking coconut water prior to exercise improved the capacity to exercise in a high-temperature environment. Another found that coconut water drunk

The Aravalli Range is one of the oldest geological features on <u>Earth</u>. It is rich in <u>natural</u> <u>resources</u> and serves as a check to the growth of the western desert. Though heavily forested in the south, it is generally bare and thinly populated, consisting of large areas of sand and stone and of masses of rose-coloured quartzite.

The "Great Green Wall of Aravalli" is a proposed ecological corridor stretching 1,600 km and 5 km wide along the Aravalli range, extending from Gujarat to Delhi. It aims to connect with the Shivalik hill range and plans to plant 1.35 billion native trees over the next decade to restore the forest cover in the region. Inspired by Africa's Great Green Wall, this initiative will serve as a barrier against pollution, with industrial activities accounting for 51% of the pollution, vehicles for 27%, crop burning for 8%, and Diwali fireworks for 5%.

The Sariska–Delhi leopard wildlife corridor or the Northern Aravalli leopard wildlife corridor is a 200 km long important <u>biodiversity</u> and <u>wildlife corridor</u> which runs from the <u>Sariska Tiger Reserve</u> in Rajasthan to Delhi Ridge. This corridor is an important habitat for the Indian <u>leopards</u> and <u>jackals</u> of Aravalli. Urban development, especially the highways and railways bisecting the Aravalli range and wildlife corridor in several places pose a great risk.

Large parts of Aravalli are legally and physically unprotected, with no wildlife passages and little or no wildlife conservation work resulting in deaths of over 10 leopards in 4 years between January 2015 and January 2019.
