For instance, economic and political system, their family and kinship structure, their culture, norms and values. It is interesting to recall that Durkheim who sought to establish a clear scope and method for sociology in his well-known study of suicide left out individual intentions of those who commit or try to commit suicide in favour of statistics concerning various social characteristics of these individuals. (a) "Sociology is not merely the study of individual actions; rather, it is the study of the process through which various aspects of society shape the personality of an individual." Explain this statement in the light of the passage and illustrate it with the example of Durkheim's study of suicide. (b) What approach did Durkheim adopt in his study of <i>Suicide</i> to establish sociology as a distinct discipline with a clear methodology and subject matter?	4 2
