The Bihu festival is the first thing that comes to the mind when we speak of Assamese culture. This colourful festival is celebrated thrice in a year, each having its own significance of agriculture. The three Bihu festivals namely ‘Bohaag Bihu’ are celebrated in the month of ‘Bohaag’ (mid-April), Magh Bihu celebrated in the month of ‘Magh’ (mid-January) and Kati Bihu celebrated in the month of ‘Kati’ (mid-October).

Magh Bihu, on the other hand, is the harvest festival and is marked by feasting. Various types of delicacies are prepared on the occasion of this Bihu. Kati Bihu is a more somber and subdued occasion and it neither involves merrymaking nor feasting. It is marked by prayers for good harvest.

Heat Waves: A Growing Concern



Heat waves have become more frequent in many parts of India due to rising temperatures and changing weather patterns. Prolonged exposure to extreme heat can cause dehydration, fatigue, muscle cramps, dizziness, and, in severe cases, heatstroke. Children, older adults, outdoor workers, and people with existing medical conditions are more vulnerable to heat-related illnesses.

Fortunately, most heat-related problems can be prevented by adopting simple precautions. Drinking enough water, wearing light-coloured cotton clothes, avoiding outdoor activities during the hottest hours of the day, and resting in cool or shaded places help reduce the risk of heat-related illnesses. Public awareness campaigns play an important role in educating people about

these safety measures. Posters, radio messages, and social media alerts encourage individuals to make informed decisions and protect themselves as well as others during periods of extreme heat.
