Guru Tegh Bahadur was born on 1 April 1621 in Amritsar and was named Jagmed in childhood. As a child, he was trained in martial arts, swordsmanship and horse riding. But despite being an able fighter alongside his father in different battles, he seemed to choose a path of renunciation and meditation. He was married to Mat-a-Guzri in 1633. In 1656 they moved to the village named Bakola where Tegh Bahadur would spend a lot of time in contemplation and prayers. Guru Tegh Bahadur was the ninth Guru of Sikhs.

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
