FOCUS ON FLN

During the month of April, Teachers use phonics, picture reading, number games, and storytelling to build foundational skills. Revision of concepts of previous class to be carried forward.

BUDDY SYSTEM

Students are paired (senior-junior or peer-to-peer) to support learning, emotional well-being, and social development. Teachers track progress through weekly reflections &check -ins

This promotes peer learning and inculcate habit of self-study in students and helps in revision.



Parallel Timetable

Periods especially in classes IX to XII are allocated parallelly subject-wise.

- Uniform progress of syllabus across all sections.
- Easier to arrange substitution when a teacher is absent.
- Facilitates collaborative teaching and sharing of innovative methods.
- Reduces timetable conflicts for exams, tests or special events

DAILY SHORT TESTS

Short written or oral assessments or quizzes are conducted daily on topics covered on the previous day during the first 10 minutes of a period.

Teachers Maintain simple tracking sheets for performance.

This helps Teachers review results quickly to identify gaps and plan remedial teaching accordingly. Also it helps in developing the habit of daily revision in students.
